## ***Definition of Rotary***

“Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world.”

## ***The Object of Rotary***

Is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

**FIRST:** The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service

**SECOND:** High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying by each Rotarian of his or her occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

**THIRD:** The application of ideal of service by every Rotarian to his or her personal, business, and community life;

**FOURTH:** The advancement of international understanding, good will and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional members united in the ideal of service.

## ***Avenues of Service***

The term “Avenues of Service” refers to the elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service, International Service.

**CLUB SERVICE** involves all of the necessary activities Rotarians perform to make their club function successfully.

**VOCATIONAL SERVICE** describes the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one’s vocation to the other members of the club, as well as the responsibility of the club to undertake projects related to such areas as career planning, vocational training, and the promotion of high ethical standards in the workplace.

**COMMUNITY SERVICE** pertains to those activities that Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, the disabled, and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life.

**INTERNATIONAL SERVICE** describes the many programs and activities that Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill, and peace. International service projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands.

## ***Declaration of Rotarians in Business and Professions***

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;

Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;

Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;

Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public, and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;

Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;

Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;

Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;

Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

The Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions was adopted by the Rotary International Council on Legislation in 1989 to provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for in the Object of Rotary.

## ***Attendance Rules***

**ATTENDANCE** – Consistent with Rotary International (RI) Policies, the Club by-laws, and the spirit and intent of Rotary, regular attendance is expected of each member.

**MAKE-UP MEETINGS** – Members shall commit themselves to making a good faith effort to make up missed meetings. The make-up period is fourteen days prior to or fourteen days after a missed meeting. A full credit for the meal cost is given to the member on his quarterly bill for each meeting made up. The club secretary has a list of all Rotary Clubs, meeting dates and times. **LEAVE OF ABSENCE** – Leaves of absence of one to six months may be granted at the discretion of the Board of Directors on the written request of a member. The Member granted a leave is responsible for full dues for the leave period. During a leave, a member is expected to make a good faith attempt to attend our meetings or make up elsewhere.

## ***The Rotary International Foundation***

The mission of The Rotary Foundation is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty. The Foundation is a not for profit corporation supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends of the Foundation who share its vision of a better world. In 1917, RI President Arch C. Klumph proposed that an endowment be set up for the purpose of doing good in the world. The first donation in 1917 was \$26.50. After Rotary's founder, Paul P. Harris, died in 1947, contributions began pouring into Rotary International, and the Paul Harris fund was created to build the Foundation. To date, more than one million individuals have been recognized as Paul Harris Fellows -- people who have given \$1000 or more to the Annual Programs Fund.

# *Bylaws of DePere Rotary Foundation*

It is our sincere wish that by annual Rotary functions, gifts, donations from our members, or other fundraising events, our club will be able to fund a meaningful Foundation as we intended it to be

## **Article 1 – Purpose of the Corporation**

This corporation is created and shall be managed and administered exclusively for charitable and educational purposes including, but not limited to:

- a. the promoting and aiding of education
- b. the furnishing of charitable aid
- c. the making of loans, scholarships, awards, and grants for educational and charitable

purposes

d. the acceptance of gifts, donations, and contributions for the purpose of using the income and principal for charitable or educational purposes. The operations shall be conducted exclusively within the State of Wisconsin

## **Article II – Board of Directors**

### **Section 1. General Powers**

The business and affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors

### **Section 2. Number, Qualifications, and Tenure** (Amended Nov 25, 1991)

The number of Directors shall be seven. The DePere Rotary Club's President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and Director of International Services shall be Board members in addition to an at-large member and an Executive Director elected by the Board. The club's Vice President shall serve as President of the Foundation. The club's Director of International Services shall serve as Vice President of the Foundation. The Executive Director shall serve as Secretary / Treasurer of the Foundation.

### **Section 3. Meetings** (Amended Nov. 25, 1991)

Regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall be held on call of the President or Executive Director, or on written request of two members of the Board. A majority of the Board members shall constitute a quorum. Notice of all meetings shall be given by mail or telephone at least twenty-four hours prior to such meeting.

## **Article III – Officers**

### **Section 1. Number** (Amended Nov. 25, 1991)

The officers shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer and such other officers as may be deemed necessary by the Board of Directors.

### **Section 2. Election and Term**

The officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors annually for terms of one year beginning July 1 and ending June 30. Any vacancy shall be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term.

### **Section 3. Duties** (Amended Nov. 25, 1991)

The duties of the President and Vice President shall be such as ordinarily pertain to their respective offices. The Executive Director shall serve as Secretary/Treasurer and shall also coordinate fund raising and the annual scholarship program.

## **Article IV – Seal**

The seal of the corporation shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation the words "State of Wisconsin" and "Corporate Seal".

## **Article V – Fiscal Year**

The Fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on July 1 and end on June 30.

## **Article VI – Amendments**

These bylaws may be amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors provided that no amendment may be made which would have the effect of changing the purpose of the corporation or terminating the corporation without the approval of the DePere Rotary Club.
